Ensuring they are properly trimmed not only enhances the beauty of our neighborhood but also makes our sidewalks safer and more enjoyable for everyone.

REMINDER OF THE HOA CCRS

As we see comments on our exclusive Facebook page, it's probably a good time to remind everyone about our CCRs and our HOA rules and regs. Did you know we are a non-soliciting neighborhood? If people come to your door, you may remind them of that when they try to sell you windows, cleaning, yardwork, roofing, etc.

What else? Did you know you MUST get approval if you are doing home improvements? That could be (but not limited to) roofing, windows, cement walkways/driveways, house painting, fencing (even a re-stain), outdoor or pool improvements/construction. If you proceed without getting approval, one of our committee members could postpone your production or stop it completely. Just so much easier to get approval before you proceed. The team is super nice and very quick and intuitive on what you can and cannot do. If you have a question about something you are considering, just give us an ask, and we are happy to help! And speaking of...this nice team of pros will be doing a drive thru this month to ensure you and all your neighbors are abiding by said HOA CCRs.
